RECTOR'S PLEA OVER CARVINGS

Stowlangtoft rector the Rev Geo Pattison will make a personal appeal to a Dutch businessman to try to priceless carvings returned to church.

His intervention is the latest development in a bizarre nine-year wrangle over the parish church by a professional gang. Mr Pattison hopes his plea will secure an out-of-court settlement and avoid the need for the church to enter lengthy and expensive legal action.

"We are hoping to get a settlement on a friendly basis. I want to avoid a law case which is bound to be an unpleasant one. Our parish still Conservative though party loses control of MidSuffolk

Our new ward, Walsham-le-Willows, has elected the Conservative Party candidate in the MidSuffolk District Council (MSDC) elections.

The Conservatives lost control of MSDC and neighbouring council Babergh, with which MSDC works closely. The Greens (12 seats) and Lib Dems (5 Seats) are expected to form a working coalition. With Conservatives holding 16 seats, the single Independent councillor could control a lot of power in determining how the council acts.



OVO Women's Cycle Tour to pass through Badwell Ash

With a field comprising 96 of the world's best female riders including Olympic, world and national champions, the tour will start in Suffolk on Monday 10th June.

Stage One of the race will start in Beccles at 10.30, and the lead cars are expected to arrive in Badwell at about 12.40. The racers should pass through Badwell between 12.50 and 1.10pm.

The day's racing will finish in Stowmarket about 2.30pm.

The tour, lasting 10-15th June, moves to Kent and then westwards, finishing in Wales.

Be aware that there will be **road closures** rolling through the county with the race.

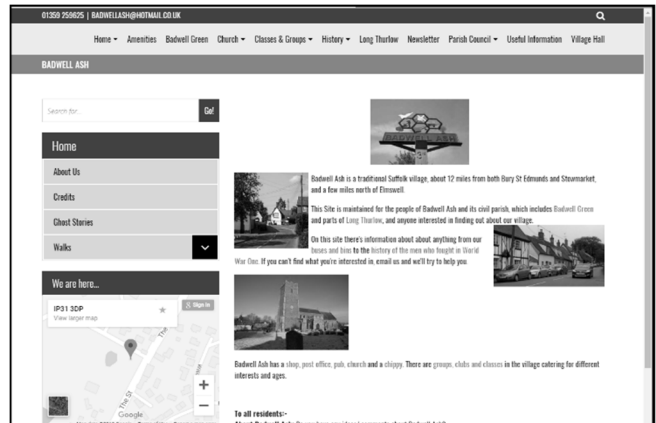
Badwell Online
